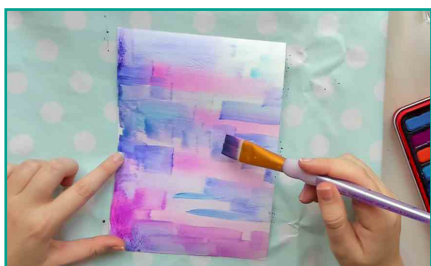


Winter Scene Christmas Card



You will need:

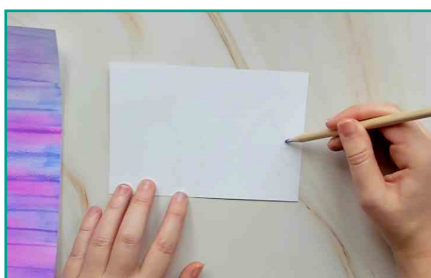
- Watercolour paper or art paper
- Watercolour paints
- White paper
- Scissors
- Colourful pens
- Colourful folded card



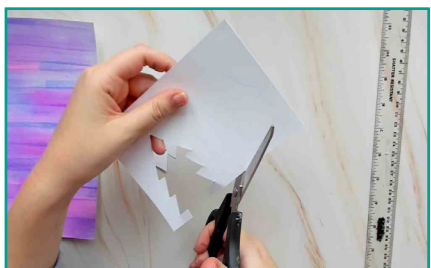
1) First, decorate your art paper with beautiful wintery colours. Do not use too much water or your colours will be muted. This will be your wintery sky so make sure it is dramatic.



2) While your watercolours are drying, take your white paper and cut it in half. The finished half should cover the bottom half of your card, it will become the snowy ground.



3) Now turn your paper so it is landscape and draw some figures on the paper which are easy to cut out and easy to recognise from just their silhouette. I have chosen two Christmas trees and a snowman. The figures should touch the bottom of the paper.



4) Carefully, cut out the shapes from your paper. We need the shapes in one piece to act as shadows, so take your time and ask for help if needed.

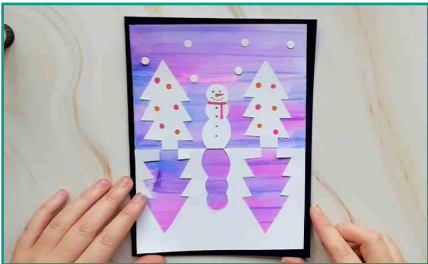

5) Glue the left over paper to the bottom half of the dried watercolour paper. Then take each figure and glue the above where they were just cut from. They should look like figures in the snow, with their shadows shown by the cut out space.



6) Now, use your colourful pens to add some details to your figures. I like to add some leftover circles from my holepunch as snow too to create super wintery scene.



7) Last of all, mount your finished design on a piece of strong card. Now you just need to decide who to send your beautiful winter Christmas card to, and write a lovely message inside.
