

LI – To use and spell irregular past tense verbs.

Change all of the present tense verbs in bold into the past tense, BUT you only get a point if the verb is spelt correctly - use a dictionary if you need to. Write out any that you needed to look up 5 times in your book. Try writing them in different ways to help you remember the spelling.
