How to Make Irish Stew (Serves 5)

Ingredients:

- 1 kilo of tender lamb - cut into bite sized cubes
- 1/4 teaspoon marjoram
- 2 chopped onions
- 1 500g packet frozen peas - partially thawed
- 3 medium potatoes - peeled and cubed
- 1/2 teaspoon of salt
- 1 tablespoon shortening
- 6 tablespoons of all-purpose flour
- 4 cubes of beef stock
- 1/4 teaspoon of black pepper
- 2 sliced carrots
- 1/8 teaspoon of crushed dry thyme

Steps:

1. Brown the meat in a large frying pan, over medium-high to high heat. Don't cook the meat; just get it brown.
2. Combine the browned meat in a large pot with the onions, stock cubes, potatoes, marjoram, thyme and carrot. Add salt and pepper to suit.
3. Cover the pot with a lid and cook on a low setting for 8 to 10 hours or until the meat and potatoes are well done.
4. Dissolve flour in half a cup of cold water and add it with the peas to the pot.
5. Cover the pot, turn to a high setting and cook for a further 15 to 20 minutes.

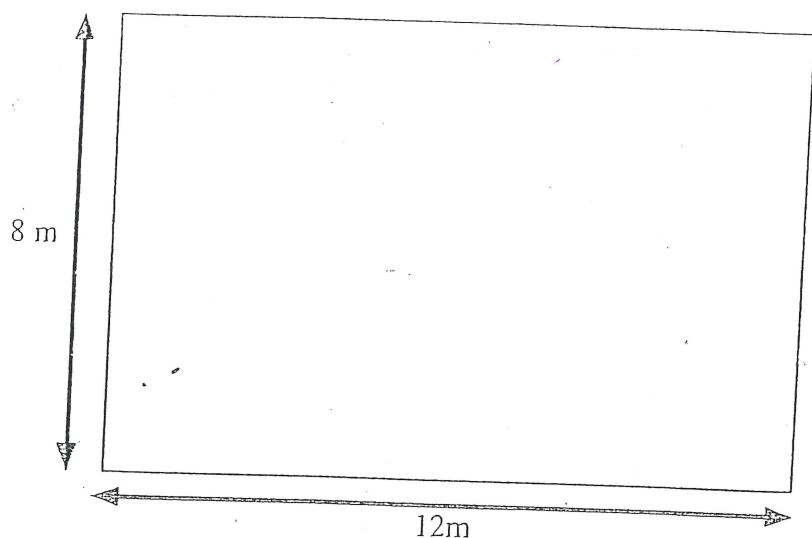

Owning a Dog

1 Have you ever thought of owning a dog? They can be tremendous fun and a faithful friend. Unlike cats, a dog needs a lot of love and can take up much of your time with exercise and play. Caring for a dog can be a lot of hard work but they will certainly repay your friendly care and attention.

2 Before getting a dog there are a lot of things you need to consider. One of the most important things is how much time you have to care for the dog. All dogs need love, but some dogs need less exercise than others. If you have a big garden and time to play and walk your dog, you should consider getting a larger dog. Golden Retrievers, Labradors and Alsatians are just some breeds that you may consider owning. If you have a small garden and not so much spare time then you might be better off getting a smaller dog such as a Dachshund or a small Terrier. One of the main benefits of having a small dog is that they need less exercise.

3 If you have children, you need to get a dog with a friendly nature such as a Labrador or a Golden Retriever. Dalmatians and Pitbulls would not be a good choice. They tend to be very temperamental and on some rare occasions they have been known to bite.

It may provide you with many hours of fun but it can also cause damage to household property when it begins teething. Providing it with lots of chewy toys can help solve this problem.

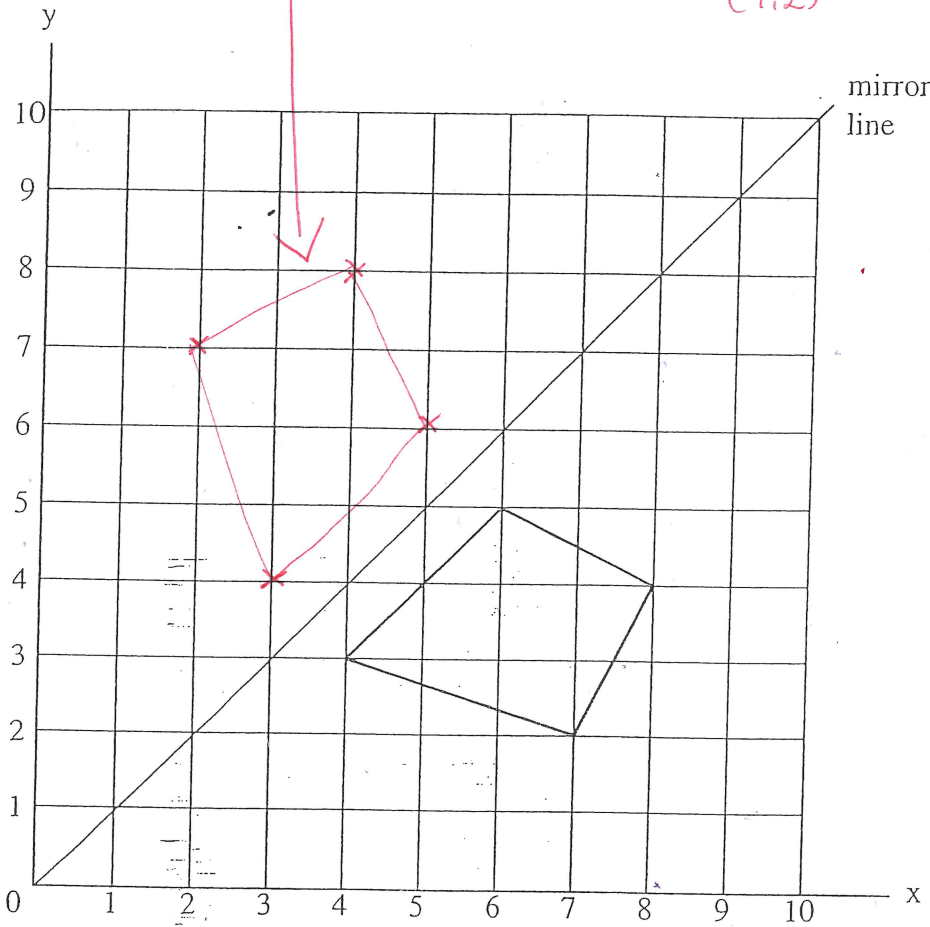
