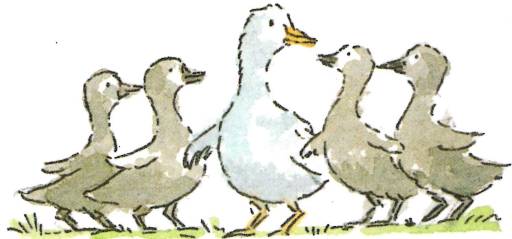


UNIT 11

Pronouns

A **pronoun** is a word which takes the place of a **noun**.



Fitzherbert knew that **Fitzherbert** was different from the others.
Fitzherbert knew that **he** was different from the others.

In this sentence we use the pronoun **he** instead of the noun **Fitzherbert**. This stops us from **repeating ourselves** and **sounds better**.
