Titanic PowerPoint - add a page or two about Second Officer Charles Lightoller which includes a photograph of Lightoller and some key facts about his actions on board.

- Science – investigate floating and sinking with a range of different objects from around your house e.g. paper clip, tennis ball, pencil, rubber, bath toy, etc. Before placing each object into a basin of water, predict what you think will happen – will the object float or sink? Do the heavier items sink and the lighter items float? Can you suggest any factors that might influence floating and sinking? Record your predictions and findings on a piece of paper.

If possible, now take an orange or a lemon. When placed in the water, it should float.

Challenge – can you make the fruit sink by itself? You're not allowed to weigh it down with anything! If you manage to make it sink, take a photograph and email it to your teacher. Try to work out why it sank. We'll give the answer next week!
